1. The CCTV system installed at the premises shall be maintained in effective working order and shall be in operation at all times the premises is open to the public.
2. All recordings made by the CCTV system shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available on request to the Metropolitan Police, the Licensing Authority or other Responsible Authorities within 24 hours of the request being made.
3. Staff will be trained with regard to their responsibilities in the retail sale of alcohol and regular refresher training will also be undertaken (minimum of every 6 months). Written training records can be made available for inspection upon reasonable request by the Police or other relevant officers of a responsible authority.
4. An incident log will be operated and maintained and will be produced to a relevant officer of the Police or other relevant officers of a responsible authority upon reasonable request. The log will be checked, signed and dated on a regular basis.
5. Spirits (with the exception of spirit mixers and premixed spirit drinks) will be located behind the counter.
6. The Premises Licence holder shall be permitted to display bulk stacks, wine towers and chilled promotional offerings throughout the store that may not necessarily be shown on the plan. The locations may be subject to change but will be contained within the red lined licensable area shown on the plan attached to the Premises Licence. The display of bulk stacks will not be located where they may impact on the ability of customers to use exits or escape routes without impediment.
7. The premises licence holder will require any third party delivery partner delivering on behalf of the premises licence holder to comply with all legal requirements pertaining to the retail sale of alcohol, and in particular to operate a Challenge 25 age verification policy.
8. The premises licence holder will require all third party delivery partners not to deliver alcohol to schools, parks or playgrounds.
9. There will be two members of staff on duty between the hours of 23.00 and 05.00 each day, otherwise all services will take place through the night hatch between 23.00 hours - 05:00 hours daily.
10. Notices shall be placed at all points of sale detailing the restrictions on sales of alcohol to children.
11. A Challenge 25 policy will be operated at the premise. Acceptable forms of identification are a passport, photo-card driving licence and PASS accredited identification card.
12. Notices shall be placed at all points of sale detailing the restrictions on sales of alcohol to children.
13. A record of refusals shall be maintained which documents every instance that a sale of alcohol (and any other age-restricted product) is refused on the premises, indicating the date and time the refusal was made, and the member of staff making the refusal.
14. An effective visual (and/or aural) reminder shall be in place at all points of sale to ensure staff undertake appropriate age checks on potential sales of alcohol (and any other age-restricted product).
15. All staff that undertake the sale or supply of alcohol (and any other age restricted product) shall receive appropriate initial training followed by refresher training in relation to undertaking appropriate age checks on such, at least every six months.
16. Records of all staff training, relating to the sale or supply of alcohol (and any other age-restricted product), along with any training material used, will be kept and maintained by the Designated Premises Supervisor or the Premises Licence Holder.

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

I am the Cabinet Member for Community Safety in Wandsworth.

All 3 Roehampton Councillors are strongly opposed to the application to extend the hours in which alcohol can be sold at the Little Waitrose in Roehampton Lane, which is a shop attached to a petrol station. We believe any change in the hours alcohol could be sold to a 24/7 operation as being unnecessary and highly detrimental to the public safety of local residents and children.

We have received strong representations from local residents and Fleur Anderson MP who are strongly opposed to any extension of the hours during which alcohol can be sold.

The current licence allows sales of alcohol from 6am up to 2am on Friday and Saturday and midnight for the rest of the week. That is more than sufficient.

We object under the following grounds:

The Prevention of Crime and disorder

Roehampton is an area of high deprivation, which, whilst not one of the worst areas for crime and disorder does have more than its fair share, particularly late at night. It is highly likely that most alcohol purchases after midnight or 2am will be by people who have been partying or otherwise engaged in other alcohol-based events. This is likely to result in an increase in noise and high pranks, anti-social behaviour (ASB) and criminal activity, particularly criminal damage. Roehampton High St and the shops in Medfield St. are often targeted for ASB and there have been numerous complaints from residents of the sale and overt use of drugs in the area.

Police data regularly shows a cluster of incidents in this area.

Public Safety

Inevitably, during the early hours of the morning, there is considerably less security to prevent ASB and crime. Roehampton has had several violent attacks in the area and drugs are commonplace. The potential combination of alcohol and drugs could only have a highly

detrimental impact upon the wider community and will potentially undermine Community Safety in the area.

One resident, who lives behind the shop reports that she regularly hears fights taking place in the yard behind the shop.

We have also received numerous complaints about intimidating and anti-social drinking during normal licensing hours.

We also have serious doubts about selling alcohol during such late hours in a petrol station. We are supposed to be trying to eliminate drinking and driving.

Prevention of public nuisance

This is almost certainly to result in more on street, late-night drinking, which we are trying to reduce, not encourage. We have had numerous complaints from residents about people gathering around street benches and consuming alcohol during the day. This is likely to get much worse if alcohol can be readily purchased in the early hours of the morning when there is far less security or scrutiny.

Protection of children from harm

There is a school in the near vicinity of the Little Waitrose - Holy Trinity School, on the junction with Ponsonby Rd. Whilst the extension of the licensing hours would not coincide with the normal school hours, experience is that late night drinking usually results in empty bottles and beer cans left lying around in the street by people who are unconcerned about their civic duty. This normalises attitudes amongst young people that it is acceptable to drink and behave in a manner disrespectful to the wider community.

It is also likely, that late at night, underage drinkers would be tempted to purchase alcohol from such an outlet when things are very quiet at a time when scrutiny is reduced.

In conclusion, we are totally opposed to this completely unnecessary and potentially extremely damaging proposed extension of licensing hours. We would ask that when this

application comes before the Licensing Committee that one of us should be allowed to address them.

I refer to the request by the above with Wandsworth Borough Council's reference WK/202484573.

I object to the application in the strongest possible terms because it is beyond utterly preposterous that:

- 1) such an application is even considered by the Council/Councils!!
- 2) the address included in the notice for this application is incorrect!

As stated in the Wandsworth Council's website: "*Objections must be based on the four licensing objectives.*" This information cannot be found in the Wandsworth's website but, according to the Merton Borough Council's website (<https://www.merton.gov.uk/business-and-consumers/licences/alcohol-and-entertainment-licences/licence-review-notices>), the four licensing objectives are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

Can the Wandsworth Licensing Authority, Regulatory Services Partnership (serving Merton, Richmond and Wandsworth Councils) seriously reaffirm that the four licensing objectives listed above are being served by increasing the sale of alcohol hours for consumption off the premises to 24 hours daily at the Shell Little Waitrose in Roehampton? That is a travesty of common sense and a total failure by the Wandsworth Licensing Authority in carrying out its duties properly and responsibly.

There is an unacceptable level of crime in these premises. Shoplifting is rife and goes unpunished. Lawlessness seems to be the acceptable norm by the shop owners, the Council and the police.

In addition, this area already suffers an unacceptably high level of anti-social behaviour as a result of drunkenness on Putney Heath and surrounding areas. We do not need any additional encouragement of excess drinking beyond accepted and approved licensing hours, resulting in anti-social behaviour for longer and increased littering all round.

Therefore, I reiterate that I strongly object to the application because all licensing objectives of all three Councils are being disregarded by failing to ensure:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

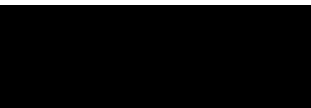
All night drinking should not be encouraged or made easily available anywhere and the application is not in the community's interest. There already exists an unacceptable level of crime in these premises and surrounding area.

Please advise if you need any details from me to support this objection.

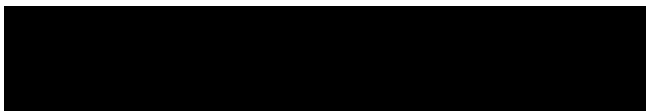

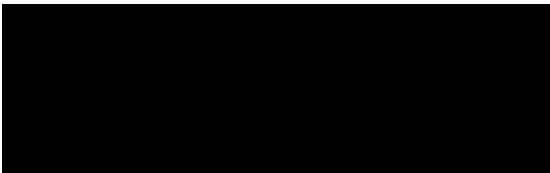

I strongly object to this licensing going ahead for the following reasons:

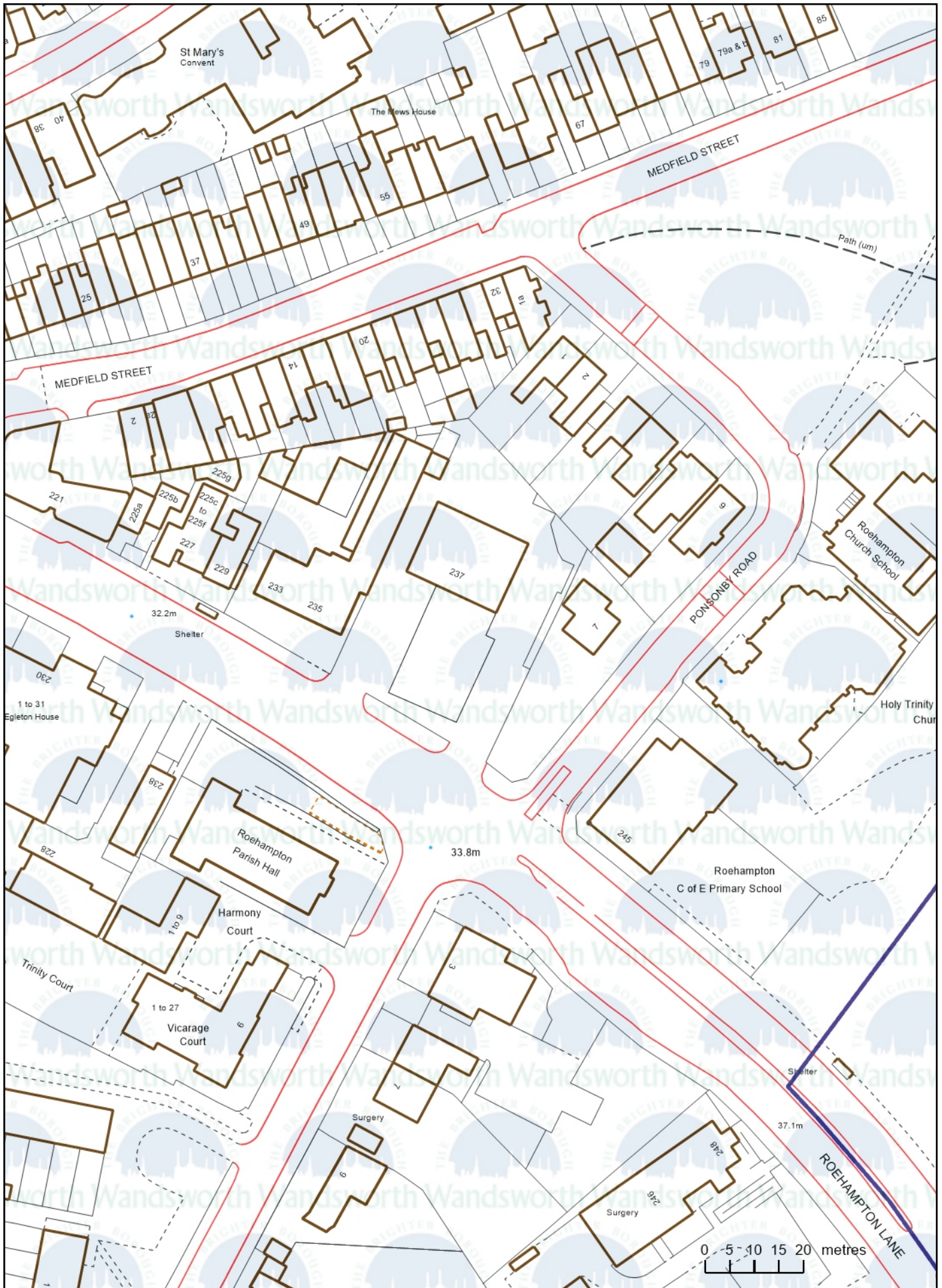
- 1) Little Waitrose Roehampton Lane principal function and reason is that of petrol station
